The Laminated steel construction gives a harder cutting edge but the extreme hardness of the steel results in a more brittle edge. They are cutting tools and cannot be used for levering out or prying wood chips. If not held firmly the chisel may wobble when struck and the blade can fracture. When properly sharpened and struck, however, the superior cutting edge will give longer usage between sharpenings than the softer western-style chisels.

The bevel angle should be about 25° for softwoods, 30° for hardwoods.

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
